BOSTON By a Letter from Barbados, dated the 30th of April past, we are informed, that on the 25th of that Month, AdmiralOfborn arrived there in a Man of War of 60 Guns, with one of his Majesty's Sloops of War: and that Martinico continued to be closely block'd up by his Majesty's Ships, so that few of the Encmy's Privateers durft flir out of their Harbours. Saturday laft Capt. Keith arrived here in 36 Days from Jam ica, by whom we hear, that Admiral Knowles kept most of the Men of War out upon the Cruize; that they had taken and fent in a great many Prizes, and that he was preparing for another Expedition but against what Place was not known. Capt. Keith, with fix other Veffels, came out under Convoy of the Worcester Man of War, of 60Guns, which had Orders to cruize on our Southern Coast for a certain Time, and then come here. We hear that the Connecticut Privateer has taken a French Flag of Truce, with a rich Cargo on board, bound to New-York, and carried her into New-London. Last Friday Morning the House of Mr. Samuel Summer of Rexbury was entirely confumed by Fire, with some Part of the Furniture. &c. We hear from the Western Frontiers, that on Saturday the 19th Instant, a Scout of 14 Men belonging to Fort Massachuletts, under the Command of Capt. Ephraim Williams, Jun; as they were returning to faid Fort within about 180 Rods came upon a Party of Indians, about 30 as they judge, that had laid an Ambush; our Men fired upon 'em, upon which the Indians fled without firing aGun, they track'd three a confiderable Way by their Blood, and on Tuesday last they found one Indian the Enemy had carried half a Mile and buried, and have bro't his Scalp into Northampton, and are still in Hopes of finding the other two. Our Men recover'd from the Enemy two Guns, fix Blankets, eight Hatchets, &c. which were fold for 1.351.old Tenor. Thursday last was very decently inter'd the Rev. Mr. Joshua Gee; whose Character would have been here inserted, but for want of Room, must be defer'd 'till our next. Burials in the Town of Boston fince our last, Thirteen Whites. Three Blacks. Baptiz'd in the leveral Churches, Eight.
